



## *eTBN Reader Application User Guide*

*eTBN is new eBook platform designed for use by Majority World theological institutions, offering affordable and scalable access to high-quality theological resources.*

### Step One: Download

Go to [www.etbn.global](http://www.etbn.global) and selected “downloads” at the top of the page. Select and download the appropriate version.

### Step Two: Install

Install the application. If installing on an Android device, you may need to adjust storage settings to allow eTBN to use your device’s storage.

### Step Three: Login

Open the application and enter your username and password (see Figure 1 to the right).

### Step Four: Navigating the eTBN app

Upon opening eTBN, you will land on the homepage titled “My Books”. Go to “My Collections” to browse available titles.

eBooks can be found by browsing the collection, using the navigation arrows, or by entering a keyword in the Search field at the top of the screen and pressing/selecting the search icon.

### Step Five: Borrowing a title


Select the title you want to borrow by clicking the title and selecting the “import” button. This will make the eBook available via your device.



## Step Six: Read the eBook

To read the eBook you borrowed, go back to “My Books”. You will see borrowed titles on the page, like this:



To read the title, click on the eBook to open it in the eTBN reader. In the desktop app, it will look like this:



## Step 8: Read and Enjoy!

As you read your eBooks, the eTBN app will automatically save your progress. Also, once books are borrowed and available in your “My Books” page in the app, you do not need internet to read to eBook! Instead, you can securely read the title from within the eTBN reader app. However, to browse your institution’s collection and borrow more books, an internet connection is required.

Please also note the following information when using the eTBN apps:

1. An eBook can be borrowed for a maximum of 30 days. Renewal policies are subject to your institution’s lending policies and eBook license agreements.
2. Each user is limited to borrowing 20 eBooks
3. Each user is limited to using 2 devices with their eTBN credentials. To add a different device after already reaching the two device limit, you must “delete” access to a device by going to the “My Devices” tab in the eTBN app and removing the device.
4. If you have reached your lending limit of 20 books, you can delete titles in your “My Books” page to enable borrowing other eBooks.
5. User credentials are private and may not be shared. Violation of these terms may result in loss of access to the eTBN platform as defined in the End User License Agreement.
